Training Session Overview

Winning Before the Fight (4 hours): Mike and Angeleic Huth, Kansas City, MO PD: Law Enforcement has a demanding role which mandates we maintain sharpened skills in many areas. This course incorporates the importance of being prepared in the key areas of mindset, physical fitness, skills/training, and equipment (including technology!). How these affect us both on and off duty will be discussed. Michael Huth is the chief Physical Training and Defensive Tactics Instructor with the Regional Police Academy at the Kansas City, MO Police Department. He began with the Department in 1995 as a Detention Facility Officer and in 1996 graduated the Police Academy as a sworn police officer earning the class Director's Award. Prior to joining the Department he worked as an armed Security Officer, Firefighter, and EMT. His background includes jiu-jitsu, Close Quarters Combat, and police tactics. He is a Glock Armorer, Cooper Institute Law Enforcement Fitness Specialist, CrossFit Level 1 Certificate holder, Taser Instructor, FLETC certified Driving Instructor, and certified yoga instructor. He serves as President of the National Law Enforcement Training Center, a not-for-profit defensive tactics training organization whose instructors train around the world to police, corrections, security, and military personnel. Angeleic Huth is a PT & DT Instructor and also the Technology Instructor for the Regional Police Academy at the Kansas City, MO Police Department. She began with the Department in 2002 as an Auxiliary Service Officer (volunteer) and in 2004 started the Police Academy as a police recruit, earning her class Director's Award upon graduation. She is a Cooper Institute LE Fitness Specialist, CrossFit Level 1 Certificate holder, Taser Instructor, and Crisis Intervention Team officer. In 2014 she introduced Yoga to the Academy and it was quickly incorporated as part of the recruits' weekly training program. In her spare time she writes police articles, has published a cook book, serves as the Operations Officer for the NLETC, sings & plays the saxophone in an oldies rock & roll band, trains personal defense to civilians alongside her husband, and tries to keep up with their 4 kids. This presentation is designed to meet the new POST requirements (pending) on Officer Wellness Training.

Legal Update (2 hours): Speaker to be determined: There have been many changes to the new Criminal Code which took effect January 1, 2017. Our speaker will provide an overview of what those changes are and how they apply to our work.

Gun Law Update (2 hours): Speaker to be determined: There have been sweeping changes to Missouri's gun laws, especially with respect to open and concealed carry. Our speaker will provide an overview of what those changes are and how the new laws affect policing and crime prevention.

Protecting Houses of Worship and Their Response to Active Shooter Situations (4 hours): Strategos: Our speakers will discuss the latest ideas when it comes to securing Houses of Worship and will also discuss how to handle Active Shooter situations.

Combating Youth Crimes (2 hours): Gina English, KCMO PD: The Kansas City Police Department has started a pilot program in one of their district stations whereby a Social Worker works out of the district station and addresses Youth Crimes in that district in hopes to reduce the amount of violence among the city's young population. Gina English is the Social Worker assigned to the Metro District Station and she will present an overview of this pilot program to our attendees.

Blue/Endangered/Missing Persons Alerts (2 hours): MSHP: The Missouri State Highway Patrol has made great strides in improving and streamlining the Endangered/Missing Persons Alerts in Missouri. Governor Greitens has called upon the state to also implement a “Blue Alert” system to aid in the apprehension of anyone injuring or killing a police officer in the line of duty. The MSHP staff will present what’s new in this program.

Policing Before and After Ferguson (3 hours): Lt. Al Thuet, Clayton PD: Lt. Thuet will provide compared data before and after Ferguson on self-initiated activity, as well as violence against police. The presentation is also designed to initiate open class room discussions on changes in law enforcement since Ferguson and the many years to follow. Lt. Al Thuet, Clayton Police Department, has 20 years of law enforcement experience, including 15 years with the Clayton Police Department and 5 years with the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department. Lt. Thuet spent five years as a Task Force Officer with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) conducting controlled substance investigations. He has also served as a field training officer, crime scene investigator, and Sergeant. He is currently a Platoon Commander with the Clayton P.D. Field Operations Division. He holds a Bachelor’s of Science degree in Criminal Justice Administration from the University of Missouri-St. Louis.
