Training Session Overview

Crime Prevention/CPTED, Community Partnerships, and Crisis Communications (8 hours): Lieutenant Jonathan McIntosh, Creve Coeur Police Department, will provide an 8-hour block of instruction on Crime Prevention Units and their impact on the community. He will cover Basic and Advanced Crime Prevention Techniques, Building Community Partnerships and Crisis Communications. Lieutenant McIntosh holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice from St. Louis University and a Master's Degree in Business Administration from Lindenwood University. He currently supervises the Support Services and Professional Standards Units in the Creve Coeur Police Department. He is also a Certified CPTED Practitioner and former MCPA Board Member.

Dealing with the Mentally Ill and Unhoused Individuals (4 hours) and Officer Wellness (4 hours): Sergeant Ashley McCunniff, Kansas City (MO) Police Department, is an 18-year veteran of the department and currently serves as the supervisor of the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Section and the Statewide MO CIT Coordinator. Sgt. McCunniff is passionate about officer wellness, assisting individuals with behavioral health crisis, and working with the unhoused population. These blocks of instruction will cover the MOCIT Council - What is the MOCIT Council? How can it help you in your area? We will discuss the MOCIT Council and where to find contact information for the different areas across the state and what initiatives we are working on. Unhoused individuals - Do you have a large population of unhoused individuals? Why is there an increase in unhoused individuals across the country? We will discuss the current state of the unhoused population and underlying circumstances that lead them to where they are and what we can do to help. Officer Wellness - What does wellness mean to you? Do you know what real self-care is? We will discuss wellness and what self-care is and how it looks different for everybody, but the importance is the same.

Innovations in Law Enforcement and Homeless Outreach (4 hours): Tom Crees, Program Director for Loaves and Fishes for St. Louis, a thriving food pantry and emergency homeless shelter for families with minor children, will provide a 4-hour block of instruction on Innovations in law enforcement's approach to the homeless population. Tom has 7 years law enforcement experience with the St. Louis County Police Department and was the Homeless Outreach Officer for the department. He has lived experience as a homeless veteran in St. Louis and is a certified in all levels of Crisis Intervention Team training.
