Training Session Overview

Securing Houses of Worship and Public Spaces (4 hours): In his role as Director, Community Security for the Jewish Federation of St. Louis, Scott Biondo has overall responsibility for the Safety and Wellbeing of over 60 entities and 60,000 plus persons in the St Louis, Outstate Missouri, Southern Illinois and Western Kentucky Jewish Community. The role encompasses Security Policy, Dignitary Protection, Vulnerability Threat Assessment, Threat Monitoring, Hate Crime/Anti-Semitism Investigation and Training. Further he is an Intelligence Liaison Officer for the St Louis Fusion Center, Missouri Information Analysis Center (MIAC) and Statewide Terrorism Information Center STIC (Illinois). Mr. Biondo is a frequent speaker in the areas of Security for Houses of Worship, Security Assessment Methodology, Workplace Violence, Active Attacker Response and Situational Awareness.

Crypto Crime Investigations (4 hours): Tom Albers, Kansas Gaming Commission, will provide an updated course designed for patrol officers to familiarize themselves with cryptocurrency basics. Attendees will learn how to recognize potential crypto crimes, conduct initial investigations, and secure vital digital evidence – all while providing essential support to victims.

Financial Frauds and Scams (4 hours): The Missouri Attorney General's Office will present a 4-hour block of instruction on current trends and investigations into financial frauds and scams facing Missourians on a daily basis. They will discuss how their office can assist law enforcement and Missourians on recognizing, combating, investigating and prosecuting these crimes.

Risk Terrain Modeling (4 hours): Captain Jonas Baughman is an 23-year veteran of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department (KCPD). A native of the Kansas City area, Captain Baughman joined the KCPD after graduating from Creighton University. He has held assignments in patrol, investigations, administration, and crime/intelligence analysis during his time with the KCPD. Captain Baughman quickly found crime analysis to be his professional passion early in his career, with more than half of his tenure having been in positions related to crime or intelligence analysis. He created and supervised the KCPD's first Real-time Crime Center team, directed a squad of detectives tasked with gang intelligence, and managed teams of analysts within KCPD's Law Enforcement Resource Center. He currently works in the Office of the Chief of Police where he manages the agency's data-driven strategies, oversees ongoing research projects, and provides strategic analyses and other metrics for executive staff. Captain Baughman's work has been published in professional publications, academic journals, and online. His work has been awarded and recognized from organizations such as the International Association of Chiefs of Police and the Center for Problem-Oriented Policing. He is also a member of the NIJ's LEADS program and a 2024 inductee into George Mason University's Evidence-Based Policing Hall of Fame.

Risk Terrain Modeling (RTM) is a spatial analysis technique used to identify environmental factors that create conditions that contribute to a variety of public safety threats. RTM is a diagnostic tool that sheds light on why crimes concentrate geographically within a jurisdiction. Notably, RTM's analytics and resultant strategies focus on places, not people, to identify interventions at a more proactive, preventive level. Participants will learn how RTM works and how the method has evolved over time from a singular analysis technique to a holistic approach to public safety. Practical exercises and real-life case studies will also be shared.

Human Trafficking (4 hours): Corporal Kim Davis, Human Trafficking Coordinator, Division of Drug and Crime Control, Missouri State Highway Patrol, will present a block of instruction on Human Trafficking...What is it? How do we prevent and/or investigate it?
